Coronavirus Outbreak - Parish Council Update

The response to the Coronavirus outbreak is being managed by central government but will be reliant on local government to ensure appropriate action is taken at a local level. Both **South Norfolk District Council** and **Norfolk County Council** have plans in place and those plans include contact with **Parish Councils**, when necessary, who are seen as the main contact able to say what is happening in their villages.

As a **Parish Council** we will ensure any information we receive is communicated via our website, our noticeboards and by post as appropriate. If you wish to receive any information by email or phone you need to let the parish clerk know and provide your contact details.
